Web Improvement Project Phase 2 Faculty Managers update June 2015

Summary

The web improvement project is currently focussed on two key areas:

- Continuing the faculties and schools development work
- Exploring approaches for subjects and programmes

Faculties and schools (F&S)

Workshops were run for each faculty during May and June 2015. As a results of these workshops a number of areas are now being further explored. We are preparing to undertake some testing to support the development of a straw person structure of future faculties and schools.

The following table lists the areas (also known as epics) which will be assessed with groups across all faculties and schools. Please note there are no current priorities within this list. Prioritisation of what will be implemented will be based on the evidence for improvements and its associated benefits.

Courses, Subjects and Programmes (CSP)

A revised structure for CSP on the web has been proposed to the CSP reference group. This suggests a consolidation of subjects into topics.

Topic > Subject > Programme > Course

Topics/subjects

This is the primary focus area within CSP currently. The introduction of the term topic allows the number of subjects to be consolidated down from the 120+ subjects which currently exist. The proposed structure of this page introduces more focus on areas such as careers. The page purpose and audience will be central to its development.

Prospective students were invited to group 40 subjects into categories to give us a view of their understanding of these terms. The response rate was lower than expected and the activity has now been closed. Based on the findings and ongoing discussions, an initial structure has been put together for testing. Testing will commence over the next week or so with consultation from parties across the university. Please note this initial structure will allow us to get feedback from testing so we can develop this further. This is not expected to be the final result.

A draft topic page was shared with the CSP reference group in June. The structure of this page is now being designed and will be shared at the reference group in due course for feedback.

Programmes

The programme page development has commenced and will continue to be worked on over the coming weeks. Initial feedback will go to the CSP reference group.

Courses

Courses are currently being addressed by the Course Information Project (CIP). It is currently assumed no requirements for courses will be addressed by WIPII.

Analytics

Faculty and school level analytics have recently been circulated. Initial assessment suggests that staff profile pages and pages within the remit of CSP are a high proportion of the top 20 pages on each school site.
